INTRODUCTION

This Resource Kit for Cornwall, Ontario was created as part of the “Environmental Health, Equity, and Law: Making the Links” Project (the “Making the Links” project).

This Resource Kit is a compilation of environmental health and legal information relevant to environmental health issues identified as areas of concern in Cornwall, Ontario. All of the below listed resources include a link or citation, and the contents will be added to and updated as needed. While the Resource was developed especially for Cornwall, Ontario., much of the content is applicable and relevant to other communities.

WHO IS CELA?

The Canadian Environmental Law Association (“CELA”) is a non profit public interest organization, established in 1970. CELA uses existing laws to protect the environment advocates for environmental law reform. CELA’s work focuses on four main environmental issues – these are water sustainability, green energy, sustainable land use, and pollution and health, with a particular focus on children’s health.

CELA is also a legal aid clinic and acts at tribunal hearings and in courts on behalf of low-income individuals, citizen groups, and not-for-profit organizations that otherwise would not be able to afford legal assistance. As a legal aid clinic, CELA is funded by Legal Aid Ontario and is part of a larger system of community legal clinics in Ontario.

WHAT IS THE “MAKING THE LINKS” PROJECT?

The “Making the Links” project was a three year interdisciplinary outreach program led by the Canadian Environmental Law Association (CELA) and the Environmental Health Institute of Canada (EHI Canada) with funding from the Law Foundation of Ontario (LFO). The project focused on environmental law and access to justice issues in six Ontario communities. Each community identified – Kenora, Hamilton, Brantford, Cornwall, Windsor and Sarnia – possessed a high pollution burden and incidence of environmental health issues, as well as a high percentage of low income and vulnerable populations.

During the course of the project, our activities were focused on the objectives of increasing community environmental health, promoting engagement in the legal system; enhancing community knowledge of environmental laws and available legal tools; facilitating the sharing of information between the health and legal sectors; and improving the capacity of frontline environmental groups and legal and health service providers to protect their constituents from environmental threats to health.

3. How can I get involved in environmental decision making in my community?

There are a number of simple ways in which you can get involved in environmental decision making in Cornwall, without spending a lot of money.

Please refer to the presentations listed below titled “Healthy Homes and Communities: Environmental issues in your home and participating in environmental decision making in your community” and “Making Your Voice Heard: Public Participation in Environmental Decision-Making” for information about how to access pollution data, use the *Environmental Bill of Rights* (EBR), and public participation opportunities.

4. How can I find out who else is interested in the issues of environmental health, environmental justice, and poverty in my community?

There are many active organizations working in the Cornwall interested in the issues of environmental health and justice. We are currently creating a referral list of such organizations which will be available to the public in the future.

5. What are the key environmental issues regarding environmental health in my community?

Following extensive consultation with community members about issues of local concern, the following were identified as environmental health concerns in Cornwall:

- Water quality/quantity: general lack of water resources in many communities in North Glengarry. Issue is compounded by high agricultural usage of the water, which has a significant impact on quality.
- Food Security
- Industrial Air Emissions: significant issue in the Cornwall area
- Water Quality: concerns regarding pollution in the St. Lawrence River (e.g. concerns pertaining to inadequate septic systems in use on properties along the River)
- Use of Pesticides: Concerns regarding use of pesticides residentially and agriculturally
- Brownfields: pockets of brownfields exist in north Cornwall
